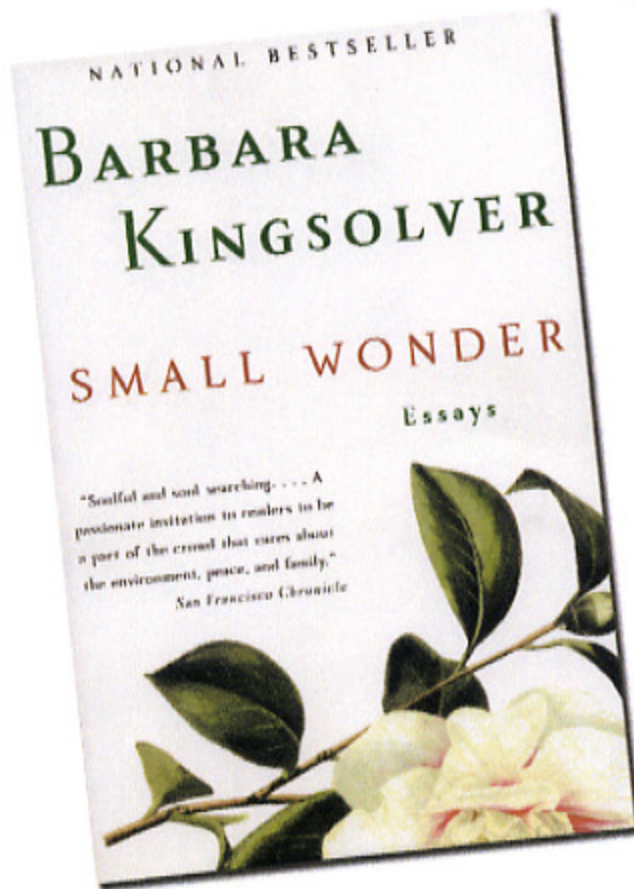

Barbara Kingsolver's published books include five widely acclaimed novels, as well as collections of short stories, poetry, an oral history, a previous essay collection, and now her new essays, *Small Wonder*. Her first novel, *The Bean Trees*, has been adapted into the core English literature curriculum in colleges and high schools throughout the country, and her highly praised *The Poisonwood Bible* won literary awards at home and abroad. Her latest novel, *Prodigal Summer*, was published in 2000. Kingsolver's work has

appeared in numerous literary anthologies and periodicals, for which she regularly writes reviews and articles on a wide range of topics, particularly in the areas of social justice and the environment. Her books have been translated and published throughout the world in more than a dozen languages. In 2000, Kingsolver was the recipient of the National Humanities Medal, our nation's highest award for service through the arts.
