All Applicants

- Submit two official transcripts from each college/university attended.* Transcripts must be in the original sealed envelope from the institution to be considered official
- Sit for the GRE, MAT, or GMAT (according to program requirements) and request scores be sent to FGCU
- Complete all supplemental requirements of the program

*Previous and current students of FGCU are not required to submit a new immunization record, transcripts (unless not already on file), or the application fee. Transcripts from institutions attended after enrollment at FGCU are still required.

International Applicants

- International students (and U.S. students with international transcripts) must have a course by course evaluation of international transcripts by an approved private company, such as, World Education Services, Josef Silny and Associates, INC or AACRAO
- Applicants from countries where English is not the official language must submit a minimum TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of 550 (paper-based test) or 213 (computer-based test) or 79 (Internet-based)

Admission Requirements

Master of Arts (M.A.) English

Applicants must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0 or a combined score of at least 1000 on the GRE, the names and contact information of 2 college or university faculty members who will serve as references, a statement of personal goals, and a writing sample of 8-10 pages.

Master of Science (M.S.) Environmental Science

Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in upper-division coursework (last 60 credit hours of baccalaureate degree), a combined score of 1000 on the GRE with a minimum of 400 on the verbal and quantitative sections. Submit two letters of recommendation, a cover letter of introduction and a statement of research goals. Prerequisite: General ecology course and statistics course.

Master of Arts (M.A.) Environmental Studies

Applicants must have a minimum of 3.0 GPA in upper-division coursework (last 60 credit hours of baccalaureate degree), a combined score of 1000 on the GRE with a minimum of 400 on the verbal and quantitative sections. Submit three letters of recommendation from people familiar with the applicant's academic and research potential, a cover letter of introduction including a statement of research goals and career interests. Master of Arts (M.A.) History

Applicants must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0 (with at least 15 credits in History and a 3.0 GPA in all History courses), a combined score of at least 1000 on the GRE with a minimum of 500 on the verbal section, two letters of recommendation from past professors or mentors, and a personal statement of interest in pursuing graduate work in history (2-3 pages).
