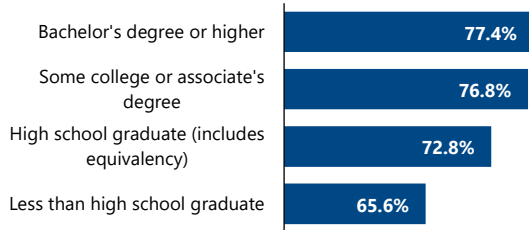

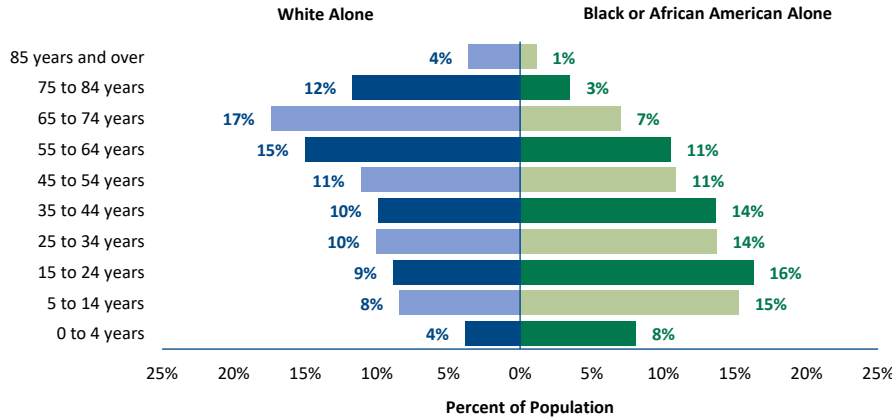
## Labor Force Participation Rate (2019)

Labor force participation for college-educated residents is higher than those with at most a high school diploma.



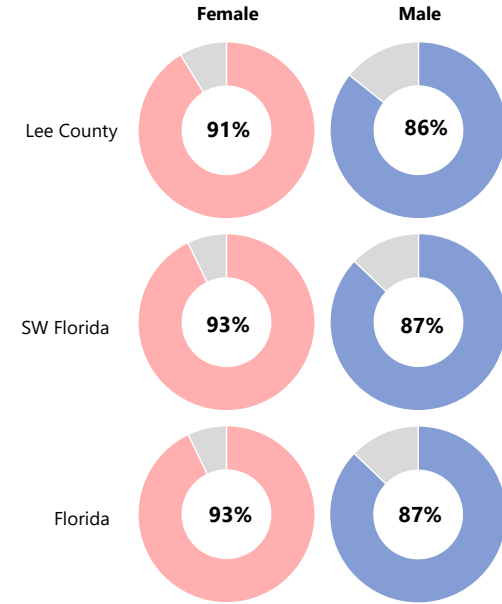
## Race by Age (2019)

The white population tends to skew older, while the black population tends to skew younger.

The graduation rate for males and females was lower than both the state and nation.

LQ below one, 2020

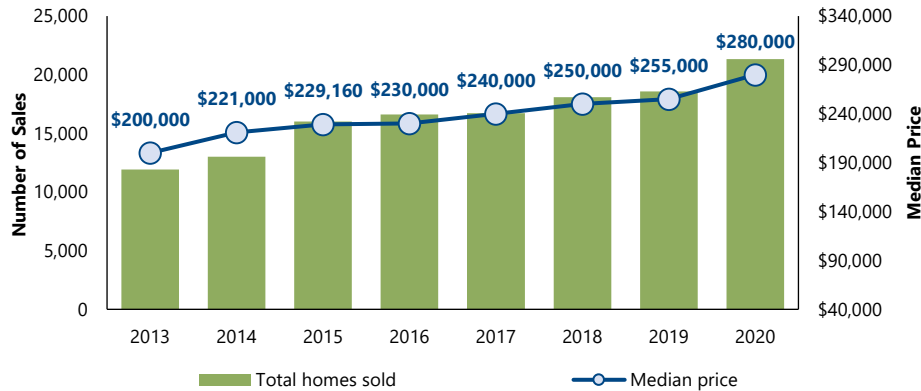
Growth in LQ, 2015 to 2020

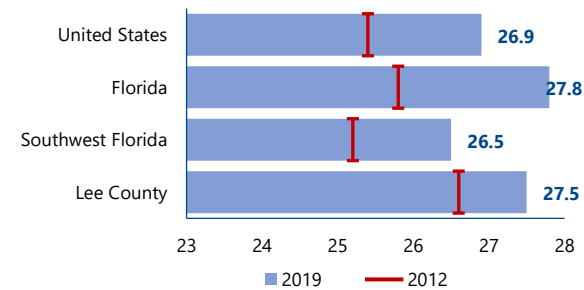
## Single-Family Home Sales

The median price for a single-family home has grown substantially since 2013.



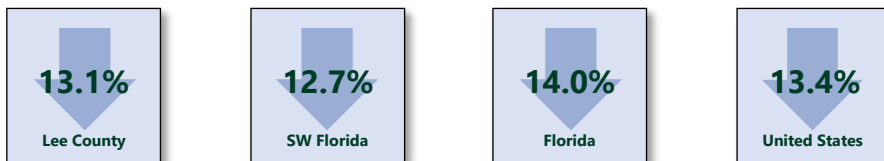
## Mean Travel Time to Work (2019)
