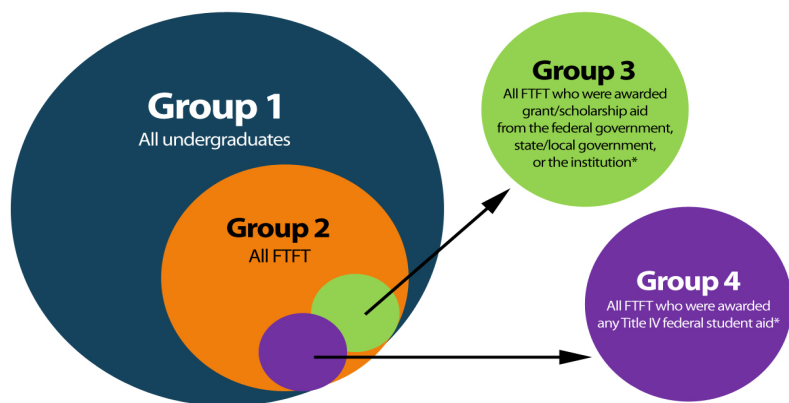
Overview
